Welcome To Sale 73

Welcome to our first sale for 2011, and once again it is a winner! Thanks as always to the numerous vendors for providing such an interesting and saleable selection. Once again we have a waiting list for the next sale, and due to demand, have scheduled a third auction for 2011, which will be held in Melbourne in June, with more details forthcoming.

Some Sale 73 Auction Highlights and more...

One of the key highlights in this sale is the finest condition 50 Pound Cerutti-Collins 1920 (R 67c) to appear on the market in recent years, and is only one of the many highlight lots in this sale. Graded at EF, this is an attractive example of what has always been a beautiful and rare banknote. Estimated to bring around \$150,000, this note is one of the finer examples of this issue, and is a great type note for someone wanting a superb example of a rare 50 Pound, or as an ideal investment item as these large denomination banknotes in high grade rarely turn up.

Another highly desirable item on offer in this sale is the very rare 1813 Dump D/2. Graded at aEF, this coin has an excellent provenance being ex the P.F Worth Collection, and is also the example illustrated in the Mira/Noble book "The Holey Dollars of New South Wales". The scarce D/2 examples are notorious for being a weaker strike than the more common A/1 example, and this coin has a pleasing eye appeal of lovely old tone, and with a clear Crown, Fleur de Lis and lettering, and a trace of the "H" (often not even seen in the D/2 type) on the Reverse. Once again, this coin is estimated at a very conservative \$150,000, well under current book values.

Some of the other key highlights also on offer include a 10 Pound 1954 Specimen note, which interestingly, has a very low serial number of 000 005. This note is virtually as printed, and again has a very reasonable estimate of \$150,000. Everybody knows that quality and rarity are key, so when we saw the Type 7 Kookaburra Penny we have on offer here, we knew this coin was a winner. Boasting a provenance of being ex the Museum of Victoria (sold as part of their "duplicates" sale), this has to be the finest grade Kookaburra we have offered, and must be worth a substantial premium based purely on the exceptional state it is in. Similarly, a Type 12 Kookaburra Penny also on offer is a significantly better than average coin.

A Taylor Copper Pattern "Large Portrait" Shilling, believed to be the only example known, is another key highlight. With considerable interest shown in this series in recent sales, this rare coin is sure to be keenly sought after. This coin, and it's sibling, the more common issue Taylor Pattern Halfpenny, haven't been on the market for over 20 years, and are sure to attract interest from those with a keen eye. Another interesting coin on offer is a very rare Model 1937 Penny. Struck as a possible "Pattern" issue for the ill fated reign of Edward VIII, this coin has been (officially?) once holed, and then nearly invisibly restored sometime since, presenting an appealing coin of significant rarity and interest.

A number of rare Banknotes are also present, with an entire previously unsighted Pre Federation selection from an old collection on offer. Included are a number of rare fully issued notes, including two almost never seen 10 Pounds, and some scarce and early specimen issues. From the same collection is a number of lower grade but rare early George V issues, including examples of all three types of 10 Pounds George V, along with many other issues. The usual strong selection of Starnotes, Specimens, Misprints (including a full missing colour set from \$1 to \$100), First and Last Prefixes and much more round out a top offering.

Other coins of note include a superior 1927 Canberra Proof Florin, several rare gold issues including an aUNC 1852 Adelaide Pound and the key date 1855 Sydney Mint Half Sovereign, 3 more Dumps in assorted grades including the rare E/3 Type, and a selection of bullion grade issues including 2 bulk lots of 100 Sovereigns in aU/UNC, as well as a number of modern Mint gold issues. Australian Pre Decimal coinage is also well represented with numerous top quality items across the board.

Other Points Of Interest- The new Greg McDonald book is now out, and it is interesting to see that there is both substantial price increases and some decreases. From an auction viewpoint, we would agree with the vast majority of corrections, especially in the lower and mid grade banknote range and the decimal notes. It is important though for the market to regularly undergo transformation as supply and demand swing around, and often price adjustment is necessary to bring alignment across equivalent levels of rarity from the varied numismatic sectors. A good job here then by Greg, with some continuing adjustments in future issue to adjust and fine tune this even more.

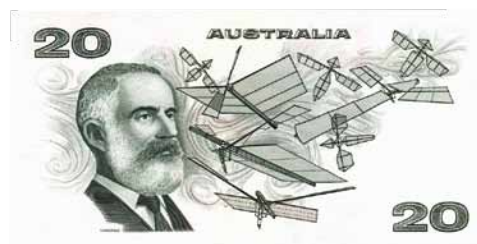
