A superb 1934 Proof Silver set from Threepence to Florin featuring the highest ever graded George V coin (the Threepence – PCGS graded PR 68 CA) sold for \$45,553 all up, whilst a 1930 Penny PCGS graded VF 35 sold for \$20,273. Banknotes again proved to be strong, showing that there is significant life returning to that market with good sales in Pre Decimal, Specimens and Starnotes, with decimal notes a standout. Pre Decimal Proof coins were gen-

erally solid, with Commonwealth just a little patchy, depending on vendors expectations. Unreserved lots sold strongly as usual, often to 20 to 30 bids and 5 to 6 bidders.
